Water Taxi

The Port District's free water taxi program resumed operations on Saturday, June 19, 2021, in a new vessel.

Weather permitting, the water taxi will operate summer weekends and holidays through Labor Day between 11:00 AM – 6:00 PM.

Passengers may be picked up and dropped off at the following locations:

- X-1 Gate
- AA Dock
- Launch Ramp

City of Santa Cruz Seismic Retrofit of Murray Street Bridge

The City of Santa Cruz and its consultants have restarted efforts in earnest to complete a seismic retrofit of the Murray Street Bridge which spans Santa Cruz Harbor. The project is a state-mandated seismic safety program to retrofit vulnerable bridges to meet current seismic standards. The retrofitted bridge will feature new railings and lighting, as well as wider bike lanes and sidewalks. As part of the project, the existing County of Santa Cruz Sanitation District sanitary sewer force main will be relocated from its current location underneath the harbor, to a new location on the north side of the bridge.

The City is striving to commence construction in Spring 2022. The project is anticipated to span 24-30 months and is especially challenging because of the disruptive impacts construction will have on the harbor, its users and businesses which will temporarily require partial closure of some facilities, and temporary relocation of some boats, commercial businesses, docks and facilities. The City is committed to staging work to minimize disruption to the extent possible, and maintaining vessel access to the north harbor at all times during construction, though there will be occasional one-way traffic control. There will also be impacts on vehicular, bicycle and pedestrian traffic, with one-way vehicle traffic on the bridge during some operations, and rerouting of pedestrian and bicycle traffic.

Soon, the City of Santa Cruz will be sending notifications to slip licensees, businesses and others within the construction impact areas. The City's consultants will make themselves available to meet with those impacted by the project one-on-one to discuss the project and relocation process.

For others not directly impacted by construction but interested in learning more about this project, the City will be scheduling a community meeting in the near future to review the project, timing, the various work phases and answer questions. Once scheduled, the Port District will make the City's community meeting notice available on its website.

Borrow a Life Jacket

The District re-launched its Life Jacket Loaner Station on May 28, 2021. The loaner station was created in 2020, but its use was delayed due to COVID-19.

The program was created in partnership with the <u>California State Parks Division of Boating and</u> <u>Waterways</u> to increase boating safety by making life jackets readily available to the public on a loaner basis.

Individuals or families can now borrow a life jacket for the day at the Santa Cruz Harbor's Life Jacket Loaner Station located near the vessel launch ramp.

Safe Boating Tips for the Fourth of July

Nearly 14% of all boating related accidents each year occur during the three summer holiday weekends of Memorial Day, Fourth of July, and Labor Day.

Check out the safety tips below to ensure a safe and fun holiday:

- Acquaint your passengers with the location of safety information and equipment on board, including life jackets.
- Waterways may become crowded and distractions numerous. Designate a person aboard the vessel to help you act as a lookout.
- Ensure a properly fitted life jacket is worn by each passenger.Remember that life jackets meant
 for adults DO NOT work for children. On recreational vessels underway, children under 13 years
 old must wear a Coast Guard approved life jacket unless they are below decks or in an enclosed
 cabin.
